


Palo Alto British Car Meet - September 8





The 2002 MGOC Annual picnic features spectacular panorama of the Bay Area; unequaled views to San Bruno Mountain, San Francisco Airport, San Francisco Bay and Mount Diablo.

Our popular Annual Picnic will be held this year on the Peninsula, at Junipero Serra Park in San Bruno. We picked a private picnic spot with a view of the whole Bay Area and with parking close by. This is a great time to get acquainted and renew friendships with plenty of tire kicking and good food.

As usual, we will have a popular car vote and small prizes. We'll have two BBQ's glowing hot. There is water, electricity, restrooms and a playground, all right at the picnic area. Bring your own food and drinks. The area can be windy and cool so throw in a windbreaker and cap.

Park Info: The 108-acre site, set in the bayside foothills of the Santa Cruz Mountains, is just east of the San Andreas Reservoir. Geologically, the knoll that comprises the park is one quarter of a north-facing end slope of a ridge that was quarried over a 40-year time period for its Franciscan Sandstone. The park is bounded on its eastern side by the Serra Fault, while the much larger San Andreas Fault lies 1 mile to the west. Costonoan Indians lived in the park's vicinity prior to the year 1800. The park was once part of the 15,000 acre Buri-Buri Rancho owned by Jose Sanchez.

Picnic Time: We'll have to have someone there at 9:00 a.m. to hold the site so come whenever you wish. There is hiking and a visitor's center with exhibits. We'll have the coals ready by 12;30 p.m. We'll be there until 4:00 p.m. or so.

Directions: From the north (San Francisco), use Highway 280 (southbound). Turn off at the Crystal Springs Road exit. Turn right onto Crystal Springs Road. The park entrance is 1/2 mile up the road on the left-hand side.

From the south (San Jose), use Highway 280 (northbound). Turn off at the San Bruno Avenue exit turning left onto San Bruno Avenue. Go under the freeway and turn left back onto Highway 280 south. Immediately exit at Crystal Springs Road. Turn right onto Crystal Springs Road. The park

El Camino Park is located on the El Camino Real, just north of University Avenue, opposite Stanford Center, From 101 take University Ave west, go under the Alma Street overpass, and turn right onto the El Camino Real. From 280, take the Sandhill Road Exit east and turn right on the El Camino, stay to the right to the University Ave exit, turn left at the overpass, then left again back onto the El Camino heading north. Trailer parking is available on-site at the park.

Useful Tools: Measu-Funnel

Recently I needed a funnel with a long neck, so I went down to the hardware store to buy a transmission funnel. Instead I found the Measu-Funnel, with more features than a Veg-O-Matic.

The Measu-Funnel (just plain "funnel" from here on) is plastic and will hold motor oil, transmission fluid, and antifreeze, though not gasoline. The 6" tall spout unscrews from the 16" tube so you can use it as a regular funnel. The spout is translucent so you can see through it, and is marked with three separate scales: half pints (to one quart), every four ounces (to 32 ounces), and every hundred milliliters (to one liter).


The best feature is the way that the tube attaches to the spout. Besides a debris screen in the attachment, there's also a twist valve. This lets you fill the funnel with that half pint the transmission needs, carry it over to the car, guide the tube into the transmission, and twist the valve to let the oil flow down the tube. Did I mention that nothing will spill while you're carrying the funnel because the spout has a lid like a Tupperware bowl has? And did I remind you to take the plug off the tip of the tube? The plug is on a tether so that you can't lose it, but its main value shows when it's time to put the funnel away. There's no need to get all the oil out of the funnel because you can just put the plug back on the tube and the lid on the spout, and nothing will drip out, even if you store the funnel upside down.

There wasn't a phone number or website on the label, but there was a company name and mailing address: Hopkins Manufacturing, 428 Peyton, Emporia, KS 66801. I found mine in the automotive section at Orchard Supply Hardware for \$5. A bargain, I think.
